## Learning at Westbrook - Year 3

In **Year 3**, the children learned about the process of **mummification** by carrying out a fun experiment with a tomato which represents some of the stages. The children covered the tomato in a special mixture to help preserve it, just like the **Ancient Egyptians** did when making mummies. Over the next few weeks, they will **observe the changes** and learn how mummification helped to **preserve bodies** for many years.

# Reading at home...

## Early Years (Reception)

**Book:** Farah Loves Mangos by Sarthak Sinha



Have you ever wondered what it would be like to live in a mango? Or swim in an ocean

full of mangos? Well, Farah loves mangoes so much, she has! This imaginative book centres around Grandpa's Mango tree, which one year doesn't bear fruit. Farah sets out trying to change this, but alas, has no luck. Downhearted, Farah doesn't see the point in Grandpa's tree. Until that is, she looks closer and finds a beautiful surprise. A gorgeous book about appreciating nature and looking closer at the world around us.

## Key Stage 1 (Year 1 & 2)

**Book:** Flat Stanley by Jeff Brown & Rob Biddulph



We recommend this classic children's books series about a boy who becomes flatten

ed by an incident with a pinboard. Learning to navigate life with his new flat-as-a-pancake body, Stanley finds himself enjoying the novelty of sliding under doors, being posted in the mailbox and flying in the sky as his brother's kite. Soon, being flat presents challenges too, and the usually positive and optimistic Stanley begins to long to return back to his old self.

## Lower Key Stage 2 (Year 3 & 4)

**Book:** The Queen's Nose by Dick King Smith



There's something magical and original about this story, in which a girl called Harmony comes to own a magical 50-pence piece that will grant seven wishes. An exciting adventure ensues, with highs and lows that will make the reader feel truly invested in the story, as Harmony has to make choices about what to spend her wishes on, and some of them have unforeseen consequences that make the phrase 'Be careful what you wish for' ring true.

## Upper Key Stage 2 (Year 5 & 6)

**Book:** BLITZ: One Family's War by Martin Impey



This wonderful illustrated story by Martin Impey details the moving story of one

family living in London during [World War Two](#). The story is told from the perspective of the two children in the family and explains what life was like before the war and then what happens once the war starts. There are specific details included in the book, for example, the exact time the war was announced, what rationing was and what happened during an air raid.
